214 NEW CASES OF **COVID-19 IN NIGERIA**

The Nigeria Centre for Diasease Control (NCDC) has recorded 214 new cases of COVID-19 which brings the number of cases to 162,076 for Nigeria. This news was given by NCDC on their official Twitter account last Tuesday. Nigeria has recorded an additional 3414 cases in the past 2 weeks, the lowest number of cases in the country since the start of the second wave. Unfortunately, the Nigerian Institute of Public Health has recorded one more death in the past 24 hours even though the mortality rate related to COVID-19 has been declining (66 deaths recorded actu.fr the last two weeks). In the past 24 hours, 405 people have been recovered on 148,530 people since the outbreak of the pandemic.



NCDC reported that there are currently 11,762 active cases across the country. In addition, over the past two weeks the country has tested 140,297 people out of 1,727,467 people tested since the first official case of COVID-19 on February 27, 2020. For 2021, the country wants to try to vaccinate 40% of its population but for now it is still in partial containment. Gatherings of more than 50 people outside the workplace are prohibited. Places of worship are allowed to officiate but respecting sanitary rules and barrier gestures. Visits
